Rules

Riders placed first and second in each class qualify for the National Championships, provided they have achieved 65% or above in total marks. If they do not wish to attend their places may be offered to 3rd and 4th place riders providing they have achieved 65% or above. In classes of 10 or more the first 3 will qualify.

All classes are divided into two age groups, **Junior** riders are those who are 16 years of age and under on 31st December 2019. **Senior** riders are over 16 on 1st January 2020.

Horses/ponies may enter no more than five tests at this Regional competition, which must not comprise of more than four in any discipline (i.e. 1 Dressage and 4 Countryside Challenge or vice versa)

Visually Impaired riders may have a leader or sidewalker but they must not instruct the rider, they can also have callers on the course.

A small fence is optional in the independently ridden classes 38 and 39, for these classes a caller MUST stand inside the arena and hold a lead rope in case of emergency. Riders who wish to jump in the independent class must be assigned to an approved Level 2 Showjumping RDA Group

The course will be available to walk on foot before it is open for competitors at 10:30am

Are your horses vaccinations up to date? Please check your passports if you are hoping to compete at the National Championships. Hartpury College will turn your horse away if not up to date! Information at http://www.myrda.org.uk/runningyourgroup/national-championships/
